



Canadian Wildlife Photography Tours COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

Last updated September 8th, 2020

The following COVID-19 protocols will be in place for all Canadian Wildlife Photography Tours and John E. Marriott photo tours and workshops until further notice. I sincerely believe that with these COVID-19 protocols in place, my photography tours and workshops will not only be as safe as possible, but also an opportunity for participants to take a much-needed break from these stressful times and dive into wildlife photography in a spectacular setting.

Note: Protocols may change at any time according to provincial legislation:

*Please review my Tour and Workshop Terms & Conditions prior to booking.

*There is currently no need to self-isolate in Alberta or British Columbia when arriving from a *domestic* destination.

*Anyone with symptoms of COVID-19; with a history of international travel in the last 14 days; or with close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days, must remain at home.

*Anyone with underlying medical conditions or that falls into a COVID-19 high risk category is asked to carefully weigh the risks of participating before deciding if you will join a workshop or tour.

*All participants must self-screen for symptoms of COVID-19 and isolate immediately if they present symptoms. There are no refunds should a participant become ill during or immediately prior to a tour or workshop.

*Masks are recommended, and may be mandated, for use in all indoor spaces. Masks will be worn outdoors when a 2-metre distance cannot be maintained. Please bring your own masks.

*Participants are asked to bring their own travel size hand sanitizers for all tours and workshops and in certain cases, Canadian Wildlife Photography Tours and/or its contract partners will also provide hand sanitizer to be used (this will be determined on a tour-by-tour basis).

*Personal transportation must be arranged for the duration of the Jasper wildlife photography workshops and for arrival to and departure from all other starting destinations for photo tours and workshops.

*Adjustments may be made to group meals or snacks to account for any necessary adherence to COVID-19 provincial guidelines.

*To support public health contact tracing efforts in the event that an attendee tests positive, Canadian Wildlife Photography Tours will provide all participant contact information to Alberta Health or the British Columbia Ministry of Health.

*Participants will be asked to abstain from physical contact.
